Choice | Alternative Programs

- Indigenous Education
- Arts-Centred
- All Boys
- All Girls
- Languages (French, German, Mandarin, Spanish)
- Montessori
- Science
- Traditional Learning Centre (TLC)





Why Alternative Programs?

- Providing families choices to appeal to the interests and preferences of each student
- Programs focus on a particular language, culture, subject (Arts, Science), or teaching philosophy
- Informed choice is essential what is THIS particular program about and how does it meet MY child's needs?





Inform | Key Messages

- Each program has unique features
- Integrity of the program remains the same across sites
- All sites follow Alberta
 Curriculum/Programs of Study with
 ATA Certificated teachers
- All schools requiring a lottery follow the CBE lottery process
- Aligned with system timeframe for registration
- There is a designated Alternative Program school for each home address





Elements of the Science Program

- An emphasis on the development of scientific literacy
- A focus on critical thinking through science and technology perspectives across subject areas using the Alberta Education curriculum
- Extensive field studies to enhance
 classroom inquiry (approximately 10 –
 20 per year) across all seasons





Differences and similarities with community school programs:


Differences:

A Snapshot of the Science Program













A Science Program student...

- Has a love of science and curiosity about how the world works
- Has a willingness to take risks in learning and is comfortable with ambiguity
- Exemplifies a resiliency for learning in outdoor environments in all weather conditions





Other considerations:

- Extra field study fee per student for whole class day trips ~\$200/year
- Parent commitment to volunteer for field studies (3 times per year per child)
- Transportation fee ~\$35/month
- Lunchroom supervision fee (gr. 1-6)~\$28/month
- Student supply fee ~\$40

Timeline | Registration/Lottery

- Opens January 15, 2024
- Closed noon on Tuesday February 13, 2024
- Lottery drawn on Wednesday February 14, 2024
- Results of the lottery draw sent within 5 business days of the draw (February 22, 2024)
- Parents must accept/decline within10 business days from the date of the acceptance letter (March 7, 2024)
- Kindergarten registration:
 - Any child who will not turn 5 by Dec 31, 2024 is too young to register for kindergarten
 - Any child who will not turn 6 by Dec 31, 2024 is too young to register for one

When Can My Child Begin Kindergarten?

Kindergarten Birthdate Calendar | 2024-25 Registration

Locate the child's birthdate in the chart below, then check the colour description below.

2018	Jan	Feb	Mar	Apr	May	Jun	Jul	Aug	Sep	Oct	Nov	Dec	Students will be 6 in 2024
2019	Jan	Feb	Mar	Apr	May	Jun	Jul	Aug	Sep	Oct	Nov	Dec	Students will be 5 in 2024
2020	Jan	Feb	Mar	Apr	May	Jun	Jul	Aug	Sep	Oct	Nov	Dec	Students will be 4 in 2024

Children must be at least five years old as of December 31 to start kindergarten in the fall of that calendar year. This means that a four-year old child may start kindergarten if they will turn five on or before December 31 of that calendar year.





School Engage | Expression of Interest

You will need to submit an Expression of Interest

If you are not a current CBE student: Registration is required through SchoolEngage

Current CBE student: Complete an Expression of Interest form through School Engage

- By noon on February 13, 2024 for Lottery Schools
- And until further notice for all other alternative program schools





School Engage | Expression of Interest

All Expression of Interests are based on Priority Lists as stated in Administrative Regulation 6090 | Child and Student Registration and Admission

- Completing and Expression of Interest does not guarantee placement in an alternative program
- Registration will not occur until a family receives a letter of acceptance and an invitation to register
- Acceptance into a Kindergarten program does not guarantee registration into Grade 1

Please ensure you fill out all sections of School Engage when registering, uploading all pertinent documents helps streamline the registration process.





Inform | Transportation

- K-5 yellow bus transportation is provided following CBE congregated stop guidelines for alternative programs
- Parents pay an annual fee for CBE yellow bus service or purchase monthly Calgary Transit passes





Inform | Transportation

 Congregated stops are reviewed annually and informed by pre-registration for transportation, online through

MyCBE/PowerSchool

 Congregated stops may not be within walking distance and alternate arrangements may be required to access the congregated stop

If my child is neurodiverse or has a disability, what supports are available?

We believe in inclusive education and in supporting every child to be successful. Depending on the need, our teachers can access the support of administration and Inclusive Education strategist to plan appropriate support and next steps. If your child has a Special Education Code or an Individual Program Plan, we kindly request you to contact Valley View School in advance to discuss your child's learning profile. We will work together with parents and non-CBE community agencies to determine the required support or specialized equipment your child may need to ensure a seamless transition to Valley View School.





What enhanced supports might my child receive?

The classroom teacher is at the centre of your child's learning team and is supported by a school learning team. Based on classroom needs, each kindergarten program will also be supported by a multidisciplinary team that works with large and small groups in the classroom. Some of these supports will extend to grades 1-5.

This team may consist of:

- Education Assistants or Early Childhood Practitioners*
 - Early Learning Strategists
 - Speech-Language Pathologists (SLPs)
 - Psychologists
 - Occupational Therapists (OTs)
 - Physiotherapists (PTs)
 - School Family Liaison (SFL)
 - Vision or Deaf and Hard of Hearing Strategists
 - Inclusive Learning Strategist (Grades 1-5)
 - Diversity and Learning Support Advisors (DLSAs)
 - Language Interpreters





What kinds of field studies will my child experience?

There are various field studies your child will participate in over the year. These will include on-site and off-site experiences such as:

- The Calgary Zoo
- Fish Creek Park
- Minds in Motion
- Military Museum
- TELUS Spark
- Walking Field Trips to places like the Calgary Public Library





How can I volunteer for Field Studies?

It is a requirement for parents/guardians to volunteer for at least 3 field studies per year. This is a commitment you make when you register your child for the Science Program. Every volunteer must have a CBE Volunteer Clearance which can be initiated at the school.


